



Report of the Board of Managers

The Society enters upon its sixty-sixth year of work under favorable auspices, for the past year has had much in it to afford special encouragement. The fulfillment of a purpose of friendly helpfulness may not be readily shown by figures and written reports, but so far as possible the pages which follow contain a detailed statement of what has been accomplished during the past year. Our work is intimate and personal in affording religious privileges and wholesome entertainment to seamen. We have continued our annual contribution of \$250 to the Legal Aid Society and 403 claims of seamen have been referred to that Organization by us and the proper action has been taken thereon.

The Work. At our various stations and branches sailors have found a hearty welcome, rational amusements, ready and sympathetic advice, combined with religious privileges. During the past year 8,779 have attended our entertainments and 19,867 our services. Upon the walls of our reading and writing room appear the framed suggestions, "Write Home," and, in addition to conveniences for such purposes, the banking department affords an easy way to transmit funds in the same direction. There are numerous evil agencies at work to part the sailor from his money, and it is a great satisfaction to report that during the past year \$109,377.26 have been received by us for transmission and safekeeping, and during the past five years the aggregate sum of \$558,830.44 has been received.

It is also a satisfaction to report that the sailors' lodging house situated at the corner of Furman street and Atlantic avenue, in Brooklyn, and called "The Breakwater," has more than paid for its maintenance. Adequate and comfortable accommodation for 100 seamen is here afforded. Such patronage seems to make all the more necessary and feasible our new building, where we expect to furnish room and board to 500 seamen.

Building Committee. No efforts have been made by the Building Committee during the past year to press the work of collecting funds for the proposed Institute at South street and Coenties slip, but the Committee feels that the time has now arrived for actively pressing forward in this work. Arrangements have been made for systematizing the work of raising the \$350,000 which will be necessary to erect and equip the proposed building, and, with the coming of better business conditions, the Committee feels very hopeful that enough of this sum may be raised before May 1st, 1910, to enable the Committee to start the erection

of the proposed building at that time. The earnest and active co-operation and interest of all members of the Society and of the Board of Managers is asked for in this endeavor which is calculated to so greatly advance the work of our Society, and to place it upon an enduring foundation.

It is felt by the Committee that if the building can be erected and fully paid for, the income derived from it will be sufficient to render it self-supporting.

Shipping Bureau. We have shipped during the year from our Battery Station 2,099 men, and from our North River Station 417 men, making a grand total of 2,516, without their being obliged to pay any blood money, illegal shipping fees and bonuses. The protection we have afforded, and the hospitality we have extended to sailors on shore, have constantly lessened the criminal traffic in human beings by crimps and sailors' boardinghouse keepers. It is estimated that 147,379 men have visited our reading rooms and Sailors' Home, and many of these have applied for and obtained shipment, and, to a considerable extent, captains seeking crews have availed themselves of this method of getting them. Our new shipping Department continues to supply the United States Naval Auxiliary Service, which ships men in this port exclusively, from our Battery Station.

Legislation. Our Committee on Legislation has been watchful in securing compliance with the laws for the protection of seamen, enacted last year, and described in our last report. Efforts have been made toward securing the general use of life-saving appliances on many classes of vessels.

Harbor Boat. The harbor boat "Sentinel" has made 452 trips and visited 2,698 ships during the current year, and has greatly added to the efficiency of the work of our Institute by transporting 1,694 seamen from ship to shore, from harbor to hospitals, and for religious services at the Floating Church.

In Memoriam. Death has taken from us one of our clerical Vice-Presidents, the Rev. W. R. Huntington, a devoted friend of the Society, who by his wise counsel and active participation in its management has shown his sincere interest in our work. The death of one of our Lay Vice-Presidents, Mr. Benoni Lockwood, is keenly felt, for

his cheering presence, so familiar for a very long time in the Floating Church and in our Committee and Board Meetings, and his genial, warm-hearted manner toward all who were in any way connected with the Institute, made him greatly beloved, and his usefulness was untiring. He is a lasting inspiration. We shall also miss the kindly aid and services of Mr. George R. Bonney, who was corresponding secretary during the greater part of his 18 years of service as one of the Managers of the Institute.

Our former Chaplain, Rev. Isaac Maguire, who, by reason of impaired health, was retired in 1902, after thirty years of devoted service in preaching out-of-doors and in the station at Coenties slip, and in ministering to boatmen and bargemen and their wives and children, by whom he was beloved, passed away in July last.

A short time since our efficient Chaplain, the Rev. A. R. Mansfield, was offered the Chaplaincy of the Sailors' Snug Harbor, but at a considerable financial sacrifice he declined the appointment to continue his zealous labors with us.

We greatly regret that ill-health has compelled the resignation of one of our most active and valued Lay Vice-Presidents, Mr. O. Egerton Schmidt, who has done so much to improve the condition of seamen and to promote the interest of our Society.

Legacies. The Society has received a legacy of \$5,000 from the estate of Mr. Winfield Tucker, and we have been apprised of a legacy of \$7,000 in the will of Miss Mary L. King.

Now that the need of an enlarged Merchant Marine is receiving increased attention from Congress and the present administration, we must believe that this work for seamen will find new friends. We believe that the return in terms of practical helpfulness will challenge comparison with any other charity in this city.

Canon XVII provides that the Seamen's Church Institute of New York is to be reckoned among the Church charities for which provision is to be made, and the attention of the clergy is called to this fact.






Report of the Committee on Legislation.

The new legislation for the protection of seamen set forth in last year's report continues to bear fruit which amply justifies the expense and labor bestowed by this society in their behalf. Its benefits will continue to be felt more and more as time goes on, not only by our increasing merchant marine, but also by all seaman, whatever their nationality and under whatever flag they sail, who frequent American ports.

We cannot show statistics of lives saved, but we are satisfied that fewer lives will be sacrificed and fewer families impoverished under the new methods, regulations and life-saving appliances now required by law.

It is a matter of special rejoicing that the legislative drift is more than ever in favor of increasing care and watchfulness over the men of the sea who are now recognized as an asset of increasing value to our country's commerce and growing seacoast.




