of the Chapel could not be ascertained  
from them. The Watchman stated that  
she sank suddenly at the horn mentioned  
above. The Sexton stated that he had  
tried the pumps the day before the  
accident, and altho' the wind had  
been blowing very strong for two days  
preceeding he found one hulk dry &

the other had made so little water that he pumped it out in five minutes. He was at the Chapel as late as 9 P.M. of the day before the accident.

The Committee on repairs to whom was referred the Resolutions of the Superintending Committee of the Church of Our Saviour passed Jan<sup>y</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> 1822 last conferring power to raise & repair their Chapel respectfully report

Chapel That after raising the Chapel on the Dock, examination was made by the Marine Surveyors, and it was found, to have been sustained. See their report herewith marked A.

After several interviews with the officers of the Howard Insurance Co (in which your Committee with pleasure report, the desire on the part of said Company for a speedy & amicable adjustment of our claim for loss) your Committee deemed it advisable to accept the sum of \$1500 from said Co as Compromise in full of all claims for loss arising under their policy.

This sum was promptly paid on the day of adjustment and together

with the proceeds of the Old Copper amounting to \$664.<sup>43</sup> placed at the disposal of your Committee the sum of \$2164<sup>43</sup>/<sub>100</sub> -

Your Committee submit the following reasons why it was deemed <sup>more</sup> wise to accept the compromise than to proceed with the repairs under the Survey

1<sup>st</sup> - A saving could be made in many items by departing from the strict letter of the Survey as for instance using ~~some~~ of the old material in the repairs - & substituting felt & board sheathing which your Committee and other Experienced persons deemed fully as serviceable for the purpose it would be used - as Copper.

2<sup>o</sup> The insurers expressed some doubt as to whether they were liable and questioned if the boats were sea-worthy. And if we had gone on with the repairs as we would have had a right to do under the Survey it might have led to some unpleasant Controversy

3<sup>o</sup> If your Committee had made the repairs according to the Survey the Society would have been obliged to pay one third of all new work,



and some things would not have been allowed by the Company and had not one claim been allowed made out on expenditures must have been large.

Your Committee have expended as per Schedule B annex'd the amount of \$2102.<sup>61</sup> which includes estimate for Broom fender and leaving a balance on hand of \$61.<sup>82</sup>/<sub>100</sub>.

In Conclusion your Committee feel warranted in reporting that according to the judgment of those competent to decide the boats of the Chapel are sound. Much extra <sup>work</sup> strengthening has been added and in every respect the Chapel is now in good order and (extraordinaries excepted) will last for years without further outlay.

In appearance both the interior & exterior of the Chapel have been improved and your Committee hope the Superintending Committee will approve their action.
