Weather bright & beautiful. Service on the pier forty Center ship - this being first service in month commenced at 10 1/2 o'clock so as to enable Mr McQuire to go to the Flotilla at 12 for the Communion.

At first only some half a dozen present but before the close the congregation had increased to 75 or 80 - The Missionary made a most earnest appeal on the subject of true religion - taking as his text. "Oh ye know these things but ye do not have them." A slight interruption by a drunken man - well deserved, gave an opportunity to the Missionary to administer a ^{tearful} ~~whispering~~ rebuke to the ungodly.

Weather very warm, but bright & clear - services held on a barge alongside the Pier - Rev Mr McQuinn preached a most earnest sermon with the text taken from the Epistle for the day, - "God hath not called us into uncleanness but into holiness" - The sermon was listened to with marked attention by all who remained - About 40 persons - all boatmen - were present for a greater or less time during the services & about 25 remained throughout - After service - a few came to the room for papers - Three young men - belonging to the barge on which the services were held - voluntarily came forward - while the sermon was being preached & asked to be permitted to sign the Temperance pledge - Pledges were procured and they signed

and took them away - declaring
they would have them framed
and keep them always in sight.
