The Coroner held an inquest on Saturday, and a verdict was rendered, death by drowning.

He most thankfully received the books with his shipmate accompanying him who was also supplied with books left the chapel with the warmest expressions of gratitude these received for many days.

Mrs Commodore Rogers & Mrs de Francis Visitor of Brooklyn were at Church this afternoon and expressed a deep interest in the services and the attendance of the visitors.

At 11 P.M. was called from my house to baptize a sick child lying dangerously ill at an alley in Munroe St with dysentery.
