Owing to constant heavy rain and wind, the services could not be held outside. There was no boat or vessel available in such weather.

The Missionary therefore proceeded, in the room, with an audience of "few that is Eight Souls". He followed the service by a faithful sermon, with ~~the~~ same hearers, and had an addition of two more seamen during the discourse. So that in the end, with Minister included, eleven persons joined in the closing devotions. Mr Kimmel had been about the docks with tracts and cards, and so had the Sexton.

Thus under the most unfavorable circumstances every appointment and usage of the station has been observed; and this fidelity can never be unfruitful of good effects.

Numbering, all told 14 persons - Tracts were distributed to 7 boatmen including one colored seaman from Gambia on the Coast of Africa - This poor native African was observed to kneel down upon first entering the room, and gave great attention to all that was said - he expressed much gratitude, in broken English, for the books given him, and left the room apparently, with great reluctance - Rev Mr Walker having passed the interval between the services at home, was rather weak in body for the long fast.
